

STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW GRADUATION RATES

In compliance with the federal Student Right-to-Know mandates of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, Grand View University is reporting graduation rates for a select group of students who entered Grand View in the Fall 2002 semester. This report identifies percentages of students who had completed their programs by August 31, 2008. These rates are disclosed for the entire Fall 2002 cohort and for those receiving athletically-related student aid.

The student group, as specified by federal law, includes only students who were:

- Enrolled in credit classes **FULL-TIME**
- Entering college for the **FIRST TIME** in the Fall 2002 semester and
- **SEEKING A DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE**

Definitions:

- **Graduation Rate:** The graduation rate is based on 6 years of attendance that equates to 150% of our longest program.
- **Athletically-related student aid:** Any scholarship, grant or other form of financial assistance, the terms of which require the recipient to participate in a program of intercollegiate athletics.
